A 'tour of the Parish' will be organised to launch the 'new look' snickets map that includes Box Road in Spring. This project was completely externally funded.

CAM'S HIDDEN SNICKET WAYS

Snicket ('snɪkət)n.
Narrow pathway or alley, leading from one place to another, which may have walls or hedges on either side.
Old English **SNICAN**, 'to creep'

DID YOU KNOW?

It can take 10 minutes in a car to drive from one side of Cam to the centre. It takes the same time to walk if you use our snicket ways!

Historically Cam's mills were major employers. For 500 years a network of paths has been used to walk from the edge of the parish to the mills and the churches.

As the community has grown and the number of houses has increased, the paths are still used by local people. But some, they have become 'buried' paths, 'alley' or **SNICKETS** between buildings.

Today, we are less familiar with walking routes. Many people use their cars and walk less.

This map can help you reclaim these **ANCIENT FOOTPATHS** and can be used as a handy guide to walking in Cam.
